¹⁵ The increase applies to persons placed on probation, parole, or post-release supervision prior to, on, or after the effective date of October 1, 2010, so the monthly accrual of supervision fees will increase to \$40.00 in October for all supervisees. This will occur automatically in FMS; no action is required on the part of the clerk. The increase is not retroactive, so there will be no adjustments to supervision fees that accrue through September 2010. Those fees, whether already paid or in arrears, will remain at \$30.00 per month.



¹³ The pretrial release services fee is not new, but has been added to the costs chart this year due to the number of questions received in the last year concerning the assessment of fees for electronic house arrest (EHA) as a condition of pretrial release under G.S. 15A-534(a)(5). There is no statutory authority to tax a defendant with the costs of pretrial EHA. However, the pretrial release service fee of G.S. 7A-304(a)(5) may be assessed upon conviction and remitted to a county providing pretrial release services, if the defendant actually was accepted and released to the supervision of the agency providing the services. Therefore if a *county* agency provides pretrial release services, including EHA, this \$15.00 fee may be assessed upon conviction and remitted to the county.

¹⁴ Note that the bill of costs (AOC-CR-381) does not have a pre-printed entry for the costs applicable to offenses for adult front-seat seat belt violations and motorcycle/moped helmet and occupancy violations. Clerks should assess the three costs identified individually on the bill of costs. These three cost items are the **only** costs to be assessed for these offenses. **Do not** assess service fees, the fee for violations of Chapter 20, or the DNA fee of G.S. 7A-304(a)(9). However, pursuant to G.S. 7A-304(b), the three costs are cumulative on appeal. Therefore a motorcycle helmet violation for which the defendant is found responsible in Superior Court after appeal of a finding of responsibility in District Court would pay a fine of \$25.50 plus \$215.00 in costs: both GCJ Fees, plus two assessments (one for District Court and one for Superior Court) of both the Phone Systems Fee and the LEO Training and Certification Fee.
