RE: Legislative Increases in Phone Fees and Chapter 20 Violation Fee

EFFECTIVE July 1, 2010

In the Appropriations Act of 2009, <u>S.L. 2009-451</u>, as amended by <u>S.L. 2009-575</u>, the General Assembly enacted several changes to court costs and fees. For two specific fees, the **phone systems fee** and the **Chapter 20 violations fee**, the Act included a two-stage increase. The first increase was effective on September 1, 2009. The second increase takes effect on **July 1, 2010**. The increased costs and fees must be collected on all filings on or after that date, unless otherwise noted.

The phone systems fee for all case types² will increase from the current \$3.00 to \$4.00. The additional fee for criminal offenses and infractions under Chapter 20, G.S. 7A-304(a)(4a), will increase from the current \$5.00 to \$10.00. For criminal and infraction cases, the "waiver exception" applies to these increases, so defendants who waive their appearances and pay costs and fines after July 1st for charges initiated prior to that date must pay only the *lesser* of the new costs or the costs specified on the defendant's copy of the citation or other criminal process. S.L. 2009-451, §15.20.(n).

Updated bills of costs will be available electronically on Wednesday, June 30, 2010. The forms will be available in TAO-GUI/Conferences/AOC_Forms_Memos in the criminal PDF, civil PDF, estate PDF and special proceeding PDF directories. The PDF versions also will be available on the AOC's web site at www.nccourts.org. The CourtFlow team will notify users when the CourtFlow version of the AOC-CR-381 (Criminal Bill of Costs) is available.

FMS and Cash Receipting will be updated overnight when the increased fees take effect. As a convenience for the clerks, the FMS team has added a new account code for the cumulative assessment of the Chapter 20 fee in cases appealed from district court to superior court. VCAP and eCitation also will be updated to account for the increased costs. For eCitation, officers must download the updates before citations will print the new amounts. The application teams will notify users when each application's updates are available.
